A Message From Terry

DEAR FAMILY CALLED LPC,

In my sermon a couple of weeks ago, I mentioned that I was very tired of the Capital Campaign and all the extra stress that has come along with it. I'm tired of it! I am! But ... I'm also very proud of what we've been able to accomplish in these last three years as a result of your generosity. Let me highlight for you what we've done thus far and what we intend to complete by the end of the summer.

FIRST THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Sanctuary: A new metal roof, complete steeple renovation, total exterior and interior paint, UV protection on windows, choir and organ moved down into the redesigned chancel area, pews refurbished with new cushions, new carpeting throughout, new communion table and moveable pew and lectern, new choir furniture, new sound system and lighting ... did I forget anything?

The Kitchen: Because we use the kitchen so much, it was decided to give it a thorough makeover. We now have state-of-the-art appliances that enable the Kitchen Krewe to serve us great meals each week and serve those meals on real plates ... no more paper and plastic!!

The Youth Hut: One of the key priorities in the Capital Campaign was our youth and young people. We now have a wonderful building that they can call their own. A place where our youth can learn of God's love and experience the building of lifelong relationships with each other and God's church.

The Legacy Courtyard: A new courtyard, complete with an arbor, now connects the Sanctuary, Youth Hut, and Education buildings. This opens space for all kinds of fellowship and outreach opportunities and will be a constant reminder of the great legacy on which we continue to build ... a testament to the strength of our family of faith!

PROJECTS TO BE FINISHED

Landscaping and New Monument Sign: Landscaping

around the Education building and in the Legacy Courtyard has already begun, with the hope of seeing it completed by Easter Sunday. The new sign, which is intended to help us reach out to our community and provide inviting information about church events on a changeable message board, will be started shortly and will be larger than our current sign and will include our updated church logo and the PC(USA) logo. Both of these projects are the only part of our construction that will be a new, visible expression of who we are to our neighborhood.

Benz Hall and Hallways: In the next couple of months you will begin to see changes occurring in the form of new wooden baseboard, chair rail, bulletin boards, paint, ceiling tile, exterior doors and flooring in all the hallways and Benz Hall. In addition, we will be installing new lighting, audio visual equipment and a new sliding partition for Benz Hall.

The Church Offices and the Christian Education Office: Look for a facelift, some reconfiguration of space, and new cabinetry to be added in these areas. Also, a new enhanced security system with cameras will be installed for our offices and preschool.

Here's the amazing thing about all of this. In spite of the recession hitting right when we began this project, we have money in the bank to pay for everything we want to do and, when completed, we will still have \$50,000 in a capital reserve fund to help with any unforeseen problems with our building that may arise in the next several years. God has truly blessed our church family through your generosity! And because of that generosity, we will continue to have a wonderful campus that will ensure that the ministry and mission of the Lakewood Presbyterian Church continues on into the future for our Lord and our Savior, Jesus, the Christ.

Ministry News and Notes-February 15, 2011

Presbytery Time

Frances Hallett provided a report from the Presbytery meeting held February 5, 2011 at Woodlawn Presbyterian Church. The primary business of this meeting was to vote on Amendment 10-A. The tally was 87 for, 66 against and 1 abstention.

Motion made, seconded and carried to approve the Lakewood Presbyterian Annual Statistical Report.

Administration & Stewardship:

Ministry did not meet this month. Dennis Ice will work as sexton on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, while James, Dennis' grandson, will work on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. They will alternate on the 5th Sunday when necessary. Administration and Stewardship are working on a special offering calendar. Additionally, Stewardship received material regarding endowments from an area representative; further research is being conducted.

Building & Grounds:

Dana Jewell has offered his services to coordinate and facilitate the removal of the porte cochere between the Education Building and the St. Augustine Presbytery building. Estimates have been obtained for the gable and concrete repair. The idea of splitting the cost of the project with the St. Augustine Presbytery was discussed with Paul Hooker. He will recommend to the Presbytery Administration and Finance committee to approve the 50% cost split, and move forward with the work as proposed. B&G has discussed the recommendation that landscape work proceed around Benz Hall and between the Sanctuary and Admin building. Contracted work will begin once JEA has completed the process of marking and identifying underground wiring and pipes. The estimated initial cost will be \$1,000. Additional landscaping around the Youth Hut will be considered when we have a better idea of the remaining Capital Campaign budget. The fan in the Bride's Room bathroom will be examined as the outside flap has become very noisy and distracting.

Building Update:

The Youth Hut was completed and all that remains is the punch list. Pre-submittals from the lowest bidder for the monument sign should come in this week which will allow the permit to be pulled and materials to be ordered.

Christian Education:

A committee chaired by Nancy Pound has been formed to generate a written Child Care Policy. The committee members will be Katie Robb and Doris York. The group will also consider policies regarding Vacation Bible School. Rally Day is tentatively scheduled for August 28. VBS theme is "Main Street" and will be held the week of June 13. The Service Blitz was a great success. Approximately 170 local kids from 12 area churches met at LPC before going out into the mission field to help at UCOM, City Rescue Mission, soup kitchens and food banks. Katie Robb, Paul Chrisman, Ben Robinson and Doris

York helped with this event. Doris York has provided a job description for Sunday School Superintendent, Young Disciples Coordinator and VBS Director. We will search for volunteers in the coming months to take over one or all of these positions. CE is continuing to work on a mission statement. The Christmas tree in Benz Hall needs an owner. Doris York has suggested that it should belong to the Family Life ministry, and this option will be discussed with them. The Souper Bowl Sub Sale and Valentine's sweetheart dinner both went well. There will be no Youth Garage Sale this spring.

Communication:

The 2011 Sanctuary Flower Calendar is on the website under Worship. The Annual Report is on the website under News & Events. Headlines regarding our members, as well as the work of the ministries and sermons, continue to be posted. A new process began January 30 for those not receiving the newsletter by e-mail. The Herald will be labeled and available for pickup in the Narthex on the last Sunday of the month and the first Sunday of the publication month. Those not picked up will be mailed. The goal is to mail 79 or fewer copies. If a new member provides an e-mail address when they fill out their new member form, the default delivery method will be via e-mail. Ministry has provided The Resident News with information to encourage coverage of the Youth Hut dedication on March 6. Ministry has begun drafting a policy document for use and content of the monument sign. The ministry moderator worked with Pastor Terry and the Worship Ministry moderator to develop revised duties for elders in light of our new practice of having a sexton on duty on Sundays.

Congregational Care:

The DOVES list was updated with elders who have volunteered to visit DOVES who do not yet have someone visiting them. Valentine's Day cards, along with a \$10 gift card, were addressed and sent to 15 college students. Each current member of the Care Visitor Program will be contacted by the ministry to determine if they would like to remain in the program. The same will be done for the current members of the Meals Delivery Program. Since multiple members are part of both programs, ministry is going to see if all members of either of these programs would also like to serve as a member of the other program and consolidate these lists into one. Harriet Newkirk will continue to deliver the flowers from the Sunday service to a DOVE if the donor of the flowers does not want to take them home. Ministry discussed contacting members that have not attended church in three consecutive weeks. The first report will be generated by Suzanne at the end of February.

Evangelism and Church Growth:

Lorie Strange-Paylor and Skip Paylor have joined the ministry. Bill Edwards, chair of the Visitor Bag subcommittee is going to share some sample bags with colleagues and friends in order to get feedback on the contents. Ministry would like to recruit youth members to the ministry. Ideas to attract neighborhood people to events at LPC were discussed.

Family Life:

February programs are: 2nd-Healthy Heart Medicine with Lorie Strange-Paylor; 9th-Healthy Heart Music with Rodney; 16th-The Heart of the Presbyterian Church with Paul Hooker; 23rd-The Heart of Lakewood Presbyterian Church Ministry Fair. A suggestion has been made to plan a church-wide picnic in early May before the weather gets too hot.

Outreach:

Carolyn Hillhouse-Jones was appointed secretary. 31 units of blood were collected on January 30. The Cardens are doing well and at this point have less of a need for financial support. It was decided to reduce LPC's annual contribution from \$3,000 to \$1,200 for this year. Clayton Green will write a letter to the Cardens explaining this decision. ICARE has a special need for additional funds. Their goal is to raise \$10,000 to pay for training and salary for two new organizers. Since LPC's dues were paid by a private donor, the decision was made to budget \$500 in 2011 toward this special need.

Motion made, seconded and carried to approve the Outreach budget with the following allocations:

U.C.O.M.-\$2,400; Sulzbacher-\$1,200; Sulzbacher Dinners-\$2,000; The Sanctuary on 8th Street-\$1,800; Cardens-\$1,200; Miscellaneous-\$200; ICARE-\$500; UNF Campus Ministry Meal-\$200; Lucille Hart Clothing Fund-\$500; Hubbard House-\$1,200.

Motion made, seconded and carried to allow Clayton Green to inform the congregation about the April 2 ALS walk and ask them to participate as walkers and/or provide financial support.

Worship:

Ministry has ordered Henri Nouwen's Renewed for Life as a Lenten Devotional Guide. It will be in the Narthex on Sundays and Benz Hall on Wednesday nights beginning March 2 so they can be used when Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9. The Maundy Thursday service will feature the choir singing the cantata The Seven Last Words of Christ with guest soloists. Communion will be served. There will be no service on Good Friday. The congregation will have the opportunity to purchase Easter lilies for honoring or remembering loved ones and for decorating the Sanctuary. Order forms will be in the bulletin for two weeks in April.

Unfinished Business:

First Responder Training will consist of 2-4 hours of instruction for various potential emergencies and will include a tour of the church campus to pinpoint all medical supplies and equipment. All active session members will be asked to attend one of these training courses.

New Business:

Legacy Brick Courtyard: Pastor Katie brought the idea to the Session to engrave the brick accents in the new courtyard between the Education Building, the Sanctuary, & Youth Hut.

Motion made, seconded and carried:

- That the Building Capital Campaign Funds will be used to pay for engraving 66 bricks with the names of our founding

members (\$15 each = \$990).

- That the congregation be invited to order bricks in honor or memory of loved ones as part of our legacy of faith and that they be asked to contribute a minimum of \$50 per brick.
- That any proceeds go to the Youth Development Account which is used for items like chaperone fees for mission trips, retreats and training.

- That the courtyard be named "The Legacy Courtyard."
Motion made, seconded and carried to remove Nancy and John Klein from membership.

Motion made, seconded and carried to remove Gail Grossman Baker from membership.

Motion made, seconded and carried to receive Margot Tillman into membership by Letter of Transfer from South Jacksonville Presbyterian Church.

Announcement:

Elder Retreat will take place on Saturday, March 5, at Palms Presbyterian Church.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:19 p.m. with the singing of the Doxology.
