VBS at LPC

Our theme is "Inside Out & Upside Down on Main Street, where Jesus makes a difference every day!" VBS will be held June 13-18 from 9:00 a.m.–12:00 p.m. for children ages 3 (potty trained) through those completing 5th grade. Registration begins May 1 and can be completed online at www.lpcjax.org (look for the VBS theme and click on the link to register.) Forms will also be available in the office. We have limited space, especially in our Preschool, so sign up early. If you register by June 6, you will be guaranteed a space; after this date you will be placed on the waiting list. We'll learn Bible principles through music, drama, crafts, recreation, snacks and Bible stories and will support several mission projects. Our threefold focus will be: HERE (LPC VBS), NEAR (UCOM) and THERE (SOLACE FOR THE CHILDREN.) Our VBS budget only covers a portion of our cost and we do not charge a fee to attend, therefore, we use donations to complete funding of our program. Each day children bring in an offering of money and/or canned goods. The canned goods will go to UCOM which is a local food pantry; the money collected will go to Solace for the Children which is a program that sponsors children from Afghanistan to come to American to receive desperately needed medical attention (it costs \$3,000 to sponsor one child.) 7 tip for ministering to disabled individuals:

1. LOOK into the person's eyes and smile. Don't stare at the impairment.
2. REACH OUT and touch the person. Refrain from patting him or her on the head as you would a child.
3. SPEAK to a blind person. Don't shout. He or she hears you.
4. USE a pen and paper to speak with a deaf person.
5. COMMUNICATE with a disabled person as you would with anyone else.
6. INVITE the person to church and ask how you and your congregation might make his or her visit a positive experience.
7. VISIT the person in his or her home; this will show you the needs of his/her family.

Ministry News and Notes-March 15, 2011

Presbytery Time

Sandra Hedrick, part-time interim pastor at First Presbyterian Church of Jasper, Florida, shared information from her presentation from the most recent Presbytery meeting in order for the Session to better understand Amendment 10A which is in the process of being voted upon by all Presbyteries. The Session began deciding how to communicate the meaning and effect of the Amendment to our congregation if it is to be passed.

Administration & Stewardship:

The budget report for the ministries is still being worked on by Ken Van Landingham and Nancy Brown. A budget re-forecast will be completed in the April Admin meeting and a budget report will be sent to each Ministry Moderator suggesting any adjustments if necessary. A column will be added to the LPC Sunday News reflecting where revenues and expenses are relative to last year. The relationship with the preschool continues to be examined and the ministry plans to have more to report next month. Last year's special offerings and their placement on the special offering calendar were discussed by the stewardship ministry. Although the Outreach Ministry had requested April to hold a special offering for ICARE, this month was not available. July or August will be considered as alternatives. Stewardship is working to identify and contact potential leaders for endowment/bequest efforts.

Building & Grounds:

The portico between LPC and Presbytery has been removed. Siding and driveway repair will occur the week of 3/24. Paul Hooker and the St. Augustine Presbytery agreed to share the cost of the work, up to a maximum of \$2,500. Total estimate for the project was \$5,000. Thanks to Dana Jewell for all his efforts to coordinate and facilitate the completion of this project. Approval of landscaping plans for the front of the education building, including the area between the Sanctuary and church offices as well as the Youth Hut, has occurred and work will begin soon. Funds will come from the Capital Campaign. Ministry is working to make the rear parking lot area more secure and improve safety while adhering to existing city code restrictions and enforcements. The goal is to reduce the drop-off between the blacktop and dirt areas. Work began March 14 for the installation of security cameras in the Youth Hut and should be completed within two weeks.

Building Update: (No report this month.)

Christian Education:

Child Protection Policy committee is currently meeting and looking into other church's programs. Sunday School and Young Disciples weekly planners are complete through the end of the school year. Visitor/new member bags are being examined to ensure that childcare/educational opportunities are covered. Recruiting is underway for VBS "Main Street" the week of June 13. The Coffee Cove will occur again this year. Legacy Courtyard brick sale is underway with the profits to be allocated to Youth Leader expenses. Rally Day has been

tentatively moved to August 2. Mission Trip dates are: High School to NYC July 2-10; Middle School to North Carolina July 24-30. Katie is traveling to Scotland on a Grant for a week in April. Annual Senior High Box-a-thon is April 9-10 at Camp Montgomery. High School Senior Appreciation Day is May 18. Members may attend a Memorial Day weekend conference at Montreat entitled "Being a Spiritual Leader in a Crazy World."

Communication:

David and Kara Neall, who joined February 27, stated that accessing the sermons on the website was a key reason they paid their first visit to LPC. Photos of the Youth Hut dedication have been posted to the website. Sara Maguire, who joined on February 6, stated that the Christmas Events postcard led her to pay her first visit to LPC. The new distribution process for the LPC Herald is going smoothly. ECG and Suzanne have established a new process of distributing the newsletter to visitors, with a goal to send it electronically. Ministry provided The Resident News with Youth Hut dedication photos for publication in April. Draft of a policy document for use and content of the monument sign will be completed and sent to the pastors for review/comment following the meeting with the sign company on March 15. Ministry provided the pastors a collection of proposed "sentence sermons" for use on the sign. Ministry provided a proposed copy for a new visitor brochure to Casey Hartman for drafting.

Congregational Care:

A DOVE will be featured every month in upcoming issues of the Herald and Spotlight Questions will be distributed to their visitors to help gather information for the articles. The Worship Ministry has been contacted about making CD's of the Sunday worship services for interested DOVEs. Each current member of the Care Visitor Program has been contacted and the list has been updated. Ministry will work with Skipper Miller to determine if more volunteers are needed. Each current member of the Meals Delivery Program was contacted by the ministry to determine if they would like to remain on the list to deliver meals to LPC members/ visitors in times of need. The program will be called Manna from LPC. Several members of the prayer chain are on both the phone and e-mail chains; they'll be contacted to see if they want to remain on both. Several new volunteers were recruited for the Hospitality Committee and Manna from LPC at WN@LPC's Ministry Faire. The first report of members that had not attended Sunday worship in more than three weeks was generated and will be reviewed.

Evangelism and Church Growth:

Most of the meeting was spent reviewing lists of visitors to either delete or get an e-mail address for mailing the newsletter if they are still interested in receiving it. Bill Edwards will review the next batch of bags with an emphasis on LPC, who and what we are, along with information on the LPC website as provided by Communications Ministry. Ben Robinson will be a fulltime member of C.E. February E-Corner in the newsletter will be about one-on-one evangelism.

Family Life:

WN@ LPC programs are set for March and April with a Lenten series led by our pastors on the Seven Last Words of Christ. Easter week, there will be no WN@LPC dinner or program. Katie offered to present a program on April 27 for Solace for Children (information about hosting children from Afghanistan this summer.) Possible May programs are: Education Director at Jacksonville Zoo; P.W. Women's Birthday Bash; Graduating Senior Bash and a Korean Choir will prepare our dinner and sing on May 25. Saturday, May 21, we'll go to the Jacksonville Suns baseball game; Joy Atkins will arrange ticket sales. The Church Family Picnic will be held either Sunday, May 29, or Monday, May 30 at the back of the church so the Legacy Courtyard and playground equipment can be used. Ministry will accept the Christmas tree to use for Benz Hall and take responsibility for decorations.

Outreach:

ICARE Justice Ministry Network had a planning meeting on February 8 and also met on February 24. The three issues are homelessness, neighborhood crime and high school dropouts. Research teams are interviewing city officials and people that are impacted by these issues. They're also looking at what other cities are successfully doing to help in these areas. ICARE Rally will be March 22 where we'll hear from the research committees. Our attendance goal is 35. The most important event is the Nehemiah Assembly on April 11, which will include meeting with city officials to determine their willingness to work on the recommended issues. Attendance goal from LPC is 75. DignityUWear collection will take place in March & April. UNF Campus Ministry dinner will be prepared March 29. The ALS walk is April 2. Posters were placed on the Education Bldg. bulletin board and a message will be in the Sunday News to promote the walk. Ministry supports The Sanctuary on 8th Street's participation in the TPC sponsored fundraising program, "Birdies for Charities." "Solace for the Children" meeting will take place on March 20.

Worship:

The banner made by Kathy Burns' mother, a cross-stitched rendition of six types of crosses, was dedicated on March 13. It will be displayed during Lent then added to LPC's banner collection. Palm Crosses have been ordered for Palm Sunday service. Additionally, the flower arrangement will have palms included and palm fronds will be used by children and choir members for the opening processional. The Maundy Thursday service will feature the choir singing the cantata The Seven Last Words of Christ with guest soloists. Communion will be served by intinction. Easter lily order forms will be in the bulletin on April 3, 10 and 17. Each plant will cost \$13.00. Ministry will arrange the lilies in the Sanctuary on Saturday, April 23.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:55 p.m. with the singing of the Doxology.

ICARE's Annual Nehemiah Assembly had 1,739 attend on April 11th at Bethel Institutional Baptist Church, downtown. LPC was represented with 38 members present. (South Jacksonville Presbyterian had 180 present!) Those attending were there to support fairness and justice in our community.

You may recall this process began with House Meetings last fall, where problem areas were identified through a grassroots process. Our 25 participating congregations then selected education (low graduation rates), crime (neighborhood safety/youth crime) and homelessness (unacceptable # of homeless with inadequate access to needed services), as the areas of focus for this year, using a voting process. Research Committees gathered information, studied the problems identified—including finding successful approaches used in other communities, and developed constructive proposals for achieving better outcomes.

ICARE received commitments on 3 separate issues at the Annual Nehemiah Assembly:

- 1) State Attorney's Office agreed to provide a leadership role in implementing Neighborhood Accountability Boards, a diversion program for juveniles who have committed eligible offenses. This approach has been highly successful in other communities in reducing juveniles from re-entering a revolving door of crime, and in saving tax dollars.
- 2) Alvin Brown agreed, if elected Mayor, to continue implementation of a Day/Resource Center for the homeless, a project Mayor Peyton began. This will provide a place during the day where homeless people can escape the elements, take a shower, receive mail/phone calls, safely store belonging, wash clothing, and connect with other vital services, for job development, and medical, mental health/substance abuse treatment. It is anticipated that while this would provide an important and decent service, it would also help reduce the long-term tax-payer's costs, such as incarceration and emergency room visits. Jacksonville has 3,910 homeless individuals, only 800 shelter beds and no shelter at the beaches. (Candidate Mike Hogan would not agree to attend this ICARE event or to meet with ICARE's Homelessness Research Committee, after 6 attempts were made and he declined each time. Note: This is not about supporting a particular candidate or political party. It's about working together to understand and solve serious problems in this community.)
- 3) Superintendent of Schools agreed to implement what has been found to be a highly effective specialized reading curriculum for nearly 1,600 of the 18,000 elementary and middle students who have been identified as being significantly below grade level.

These are big accomplishments! But frankly, we have a lot more work ahead of us and we need more members to help push for solutions on issues that concern us as individuals and as a congregation.
